

# Clinical Effectiveness and Medicines Management Group (CEMMAg) Annual Report, August 2013

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*NOTE Although CEMMAg was established at a time when the Public Health function was fully integrated within NHS Wandsworth, the current arrangements whereby Public Health is now part of Wandsworth Borough Council Administration Department (WBC) are recognised and reflected in the 'Core Offer' signed by both WBC and Wandsworth Clinical Commissioning Group (WCCG). This represents a contractual arrangement whereby Wandsworth Public Health continues to support certain key functions around clinical effectiveness, including CEMMAg. The role and remit of CEMMAg within the Core Offer remains under review in the light of changing governance arrangements and structures affecting both WCCG and Public Health within WBC.*

## Introduction

The Clinical Effectiveness and Medicines Management Group (CEMMAg) was originally established in February 2005 and known as the 'Wandsworth PCT Clinical Effectiveness Group'. It was re-launched under its current name with an expanded remit in 2009. In its present form it leads on the development of evidence-based guidance including medicines management prescribing guidelines and policies, commissioning policies, and clinical guidelines and referral pathways on behalf of Wandsworth Clinical Commissioning Group (WCCG). The Group, which is chaired by Dr Rod Ewen, also oversees the implementation of relevant NICE guidance on behalf of WCCG. The work of CEMMAg is central to the evidence-based commissioning role of WCCG.

CEMMAg provides a link with our main providers of primary care, acute, community and mental health services, including GP practices, St George's Healthcare NHS Trust, and SW London Mental Health NHS Trust on aspects of clinical effectiveness relating to local and national guidelines, care pathways and clinical protocols. The broad functions of CEMMAg as noted above are essential for demonstrating sound clinical governance and for supporting evidence-based, cost and clinically effective commissioning, as well as supporting evidence-based clinical practice amongst primary care clinicians. In addition, the group supports the implementation of wide-ranging public health guidance that requires joint implementation by the NHS, Wandsworth Local Authority and a range of other partners.

Although CEMMAg was established at a time when the Public Health function was fully integrated within NHS Wandsworth, the current arrangements whereby Public Health is now part of Wandsworth Borough Council Administration Department (WBC) are recognised and reflected in the 'Core Offer' signed by both WBC and Wandsworth Clinical Commissioning Group (WCCG). This represents a contractual arrangement whereby Wandsworth Public Health continues to support certain key functions around clinical effectiveness, including CEMMAg. The role and remit of CEMMAg within the Core Offer remains under review in the light of changing governance arrangements and structures affecting both WCCG and Public Health within WBC.

The previous CEMMAg Annual Report covered the period from April 2011 up to September 2012. This report reviews the activities of CEMMAg since September 2012 until August 2013.

## 1. Aims of CEMMaG

The Clinical Effectiveness and Medicines Management Group supports the development of evidence-based decision making, policy making, and guideline development in WCCG. In this way CEMMaG hopes to support the commissioning of services that meet local need, are evidence-based and are consistent with national guidance, service frameworks and best practice. The Group supports continuous improvement in and high standards of clinical practice in all contracted and commissioned services. CEMMaG seeks to achieve its aims by:

- Developing and approving local medicine management policies and prescribing guidelines in conjunction with primary and secondary care clinicians
- Providing WCCG with an expert resource on the effectiveness and safety of health service interventions (including drugs, devices and procedures).
- Leading on the implementation of best practice (including NICE guidance) in contracted services such as GP and GDP
- Monitoring the implementation of best practice (including NICE guidance) in host provider units for acute, community and mental health services
- Supporting the development of, and reviewing and approving, evidence-based policies, clinical guidelines and care pathways developed by local groups within Wandsworth
- Supporting the development, review, approval and implementation of Patient Group Directions (PGDs)
- Assisting with the dissemination of best practice, including NICE guidance and approved local guidelines and care pathways
- Undertaking service reviews
- Promoting sound research management and governance practices
- Auditing of services to ensure compliance with NICE and other clinical and best practice standards
- Implementing improvement plans

The way in which CEMMaG puts these aims into practice is described in further detail in the sections and appendices below.

## 2. CEMMaG Meetings

Since September 2012 the following meetings have been held:

- 12th December 2012 at Wimbledon Bridge House
- 27th March 2013 at Wimbledon Bridge House
- 17th April 2013 at Wimbledon Bridge House
- 19<sup>th</sup> June 2013 at Wandsworth Town Hall

After the Terms of Reference were revised last year, it was felt that the workload of CEMMaG would further increase in response to the needs of the newly established Wandsworth CCG, and that as a result monthly meetings would be required. Meetings were booked each month from April 2013 to December. However, in practice, the size of the agenda has justified a bi-monthly meeting rather than a monthly meeting.

During the past year, CEMMaG has been active in relation to the development of local guidelines, care pathways and protocols. Please see Appendix 1 below for further information relating to clinical and prescribing guidelines, care pathways and protocols approved by CEMMaG between September 2012 and August 2013 (including hyperlinks to the guidance itself). Further details concerning other issues discussed at CEMMaG can be found in the minutes of previous meetings (see above).

### **3. Terms of Reference, Core Membership and Quoracy**

CEMMaG made significant changes to its remit in 2012 which were recorded in the Terms of Reference (ToR). These changes reflected the emerging role of Wandsworth CCG. The 2011/2012 CEMMaG Annual report and revised ToR were presented to and approved by WCCG Management Team on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2012. Under these ToR (NB currently under review once more), CEMMaG currently reports to WCCG Integrated Governance Committee.

Core members of CEMMaG might need to be consulted outside of meetings, for example in order to elicit items for the agenda, or to approve other outputs from the meeting such as minutes, NICE Update, and the Primary Care Clinical Effectiveness Bulletin (from August 2013). The following were considered core members of CEMMaG, as noted in the Terms of Reference (ToR):

- i. CEMMaG GP Clinical Lead, WCCG (Chair)
- ii. Chief Pharmacist
- iii. Consultant in Public Health Medicine
- iv. Clinical Effectiveness Lead
- v. Community Services Representative , St George's Healthcare NHS Trust
- vi. Acute Services Representative, St George's Healthcare NHS Trust
- vii. Mental Health Services Representative, SW London & St George's Mental Health Trust
- viii. Community Nurse Specialist

- ix. Practice Nurse Development Lead
- x. Quality and Clinical Governance Lead
- xi. Commissioning Manager
- xii. 2 x GP Locality Commissioning Group and/or LMC GP representatives
- xiii. Community Pharmacy Contract Manager, NHSW
- xiv. Lay Member - Patient/Public Representative

According to the ToR, in order to be quorate any CEMMaG meeting needed to include the following members as a minimum:

- Public Health Representative
- GP Representative
- Pharmacy/Prescribing Representative

Although initially the Group felt that a patient/public representative should be present at each meeting in order to achieve quoracy, this was deemed to be impractical due to the previous difficulties of the Group in achieving consistent representation from a patient/public representative. It was stressed in the ToR that:

‘CEMMaG gives high priority to ensuring the presence of a lay member at every meeting, whose role it is to represent the patient and/or public point of view. Whilst some of the business of CEMMaG is of a technical nature (e.g. prescribing guidelines), other items are less technical and more broad ranging. In either case, the input of a lay member is invaluable in ensuring clear and comprehensible discussions, maintaining a patient focus, and promoting greater transparency.’

Since 2012 CEMMaG has benefited greatly from the active participation of a patient/public representative, whose has attended nearly every meeting. CEMMaG would therefore like to extend its thanks to the representative of Wandsworth Patient Group (Mr Zvi Herzenshtein) for his consistent attendance and valuable contributions.

#### **4. Implementation of NICE Guidance in 2012/13**

Over a period of years, CEMMaG has played a key role in publicizing and overseeing the implementation of NICE Guidance in WCCG. The elements of this process include:

- Preparing regular NICE Update reports which summarise for each piece of guidance: recommendations; whether the guidance affects GPs, community services, and/or secondary care; cost implications; and (where relevant) specifying the organisation, group or individual responsible for overseeing baseline assessment and/or implementation.

- NICE guidance summarised in the NICE Update includes: Technology Appraisals (TAs); Clinical Guidelines (CGs); Public Health guidelines (PH); Medical Technology Guidance (MTGs) and Diagnostic Technology Guidance (DTGs), and Quality Standards.
- Circulating the NICE Update report to the Wandsworth CCG Integrated Governance Committee for information.
- Information on newly-issued NICE guidance is a key element of the monthly Primary Care Clinical Effectiveness Bulletin (see below), which promotes the implementation of NICE guidance in primary care.
- NHSW public health staff are requested and encouraged to lead in carrying out a baseline assessments in relation to any new NICE Public Health guidance (See Appendix 2 below).
- Completed baseline assessments are presented at the next CEMMaG meeting where any gaps in local provision can be highlighted and action plans developed

CEMMaG also has a role in overseeing NICE Implementation in local provider units for whom NHSW is the host commissioning body. This included St George's Healthcare NHS Trust (for acute and community services) and SW London and St George's Mental Health NHS Trust. These Local providers are encouraged to feedback to CEMMaG information on their implementation audits, actions and plans in relation to the NICE guidance relevant to their functions. Representatives of these provider units are core members of CEMMaG, and are encouraged to report to the group regarding the status of NICE implementation at their Units. CEMMaG welcomes the participation of provider units.

## **5. Primary Care Clinical Effectiveness Bulletins**

Primary Care Clinical Effectiveness (PC CE) Bulletins are distributed electronically each month. They are sent by e-mail to each practice manager, who is requested to forward electronic or paper copies to all appropriate clinical staff at their GP practice. These Bulletins summarise useful information regarding aspects of effective clinical practice in primary care. This includes local prescribing guidance and care pathways (recently approved by CEMMaG), national clinical guidelines and other guidance (recently published), as well as other up-to-date news on clinical effectiveness issues relevant to primary care. Wherever possible the electronic bulletin contains hyperlinks so that the reader can click to directly access further information and/or guidance documents (e.g. via the NICE website). Copies of the PC CE Bulletin are passed to the WCCG Integrated Governance Committee.

These Bulletins are developed by an editorial team consisting of clinical effectiveness leads from SW London public health departments. Here is a brief chronology of the Primary Care Clinical Effectiveness Bulletin project:

- February 2009 - first Wandsworth issue developed by the Wandsworth Consultant in PH and Clinical Effectiveness Facilitator, continuing monthly thereafter
- (NB Clinical Effectiveness Bulletins were also being regularly produced by other boroughs such as R&T PCT since 2007)
- December 2010 - Clinical Effectiveness Leads from all five SWL PCTs collaborated to produce the first SW London PC CE Bulletin (1st Edition)
- Monthly (or occasionally bi-monthly) Bulletin editions continue, with rotating editorship under the supervision of an editorial committee comprised of all SWL Clinical Effectiveness Leads
- June 2011 - user survey of SW London GPs launched in 6th Edition
- September 2011 – results of user survey published in 9th Edition compiled, leading to improved content
- January 2012 - new concise, easier-to-read tabular format introduced in 12th Issue
- Feb 2012 to Feb 2013 – monthly SWL PC CE Bulletins continue (Issues 12 – 21)
- March 2013 to date - SW London Bulletin continues on bi-monthly basis (Issues 22 – 24)

Approval of the PC CE Bulletin is via CEMMaG (NB from August 2013 onwards).

## 6. Effective Commissioning Initiative

The [Effective Commissioning Initiative](#) (ECI) was developed by the South West London Public Health Network and provides a set of patient criteria to inform the commissioning of surgical interventions in South West London. This work is driven by the need to ensure that NHS-funded treatments are effective and evidence-based. It also attempts to define more clearly and openly the limits of NHS funding for procedures with social but not physical benefits e.g. cosmetic procedures. Although not the main driving force, it is also linked to the need to ensure that the NHS provides value for money and achieves financial balance. The current proposals can broadly be classified into four groups:

- Procedures with limited evidence of effectiveness.
- Procedures where initial conservative therapy is possible.
- Effective procedures where a threshold for intervention may be appropriate.
- Procedures where NHS provision may be inappropriate.

The ECI document is edited, updated and expanded (to cover new procedures) each year through the work of the ECI Group, which has met on a monthly basis in order to carry out this work. Since the outset in 2008 Croydon PCT Public health Department has provided essential administrative and editorial support to the Group. However, the recent re-organisation of Public Health within the remit of local authorities has left this project unsupported since April

2013. Efforts are now underway to re-launch the work of the Group, supported by the SW London Commissioning Support Unit.

## 7. CEMMaG Web Pages

Having become inaccessible and out-of-date during 2011/12 as a result of changes in local NHS organizations which in turn meant that PCT and SW London websites which had hosted the pages were no longer functioning as before, work was undertaken to re-established [CEMMaG Web Page](#) on the new Wandsworth CCG Website in January 2013. The page went live on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2013. All relevant documents were migrated to the new web page, including approved minutes of previous meetings, annual reports, Primary Care Clinical Effectiveness Bulletins, as well as all clinical guidelines, protocols, etc., approved by CEMMaG. Since that time newly approved items, including all of the above have been added to the website after each CEMMaG meeting. CEMMaG record their appreciation of the work of Gabriel Harriss and his team who develop and support the new Wandsworth CCG website. For certain medicines management documents and prescribing guidelines has been maintained via SW London Public Health Network website, and the South London Cardiac and Stroke Network Website. However, These websites are now no longer fully supported as in the past, and in due course steps may need to be taken to develop appropriately supported web pages on websites elsewhere.
